The first Show Committee was formed in August 1874 with the first President Mr Thomas Steward and Secretary Mr R. Craig. The first actual show was in March 1876. The show for many years was held at the racecourse. The present Show Ground was acquired in 1883 which was part of the old church and school estate. In 1907 the Show Society committee purchased 21 acres which is referred to as the back paddock and currently still is. The Pavilion was a small construction that was erected in 1925, improvements have been ongoing to meet current standards. The sheep pavilion was erected around 1910.

Braidwood Show is one of the oldest continuous shows in New South Wales. We have only missed a few shows once in the War years and lately due to fires, flood, COVID and upgrade and new lights in the arena.

This fantastic achievement is credited to the Committees, Volunteers, Sponsors and most importantly the Braidwood Community.

The Annual Show showcases our district and beyond, and we continue to see the very best agricultural exhibits and Community displays on offer. The show is a venue that exhibits the talent and diversity of our community.

The testament of the longevity of the Braidwood Show is valued to our Volunteers, members, sponsors, advertisers and you the Braidwood Community.

We look forward to continuing this fabulous relationship.

## **By-Law Number 1 - Exhibition Rules**

- The exhibition will take place on the Braidwood Showground or any other place the Committee may appoint. The Committee reserves the right to postpone the exhibition, or any event thereof, in consequence of the weather or for any other sufficient cause to a date or dates deemed suitable by the Committee, and no entrance fee shall be returnable in event of such postponements. The reasonableness of the cause or causes for postponement shall be decided by the Committee, and not open to question by any exhibitor, or person affected by such Judgement.
- 2. The Committee may abandon the exhibition, or any part thereof: through wet weather or any other reason, which may make such a course advisable. Should the exhibition or any event be abandoned or cancelled exhibitors shall be entitled to a return of their entrance fee paid; but no cause for action, liability or obligation shall be maintainable, or be incurred, by the reason of such abandonment or cancellation.
- 3. Unless it is otherwise stated in the schedule. all entries must be made in writing and lodged with the secretary on, or before, the day appointed for receiving same, and the requisite entry fee must accompany all entries. (Entry fees are stated at the head of each section in the schedule).
- 4 Any exhibitor proved to have knowingly made false entries for a prize, or to have wilfully infringed any of the regulations, would render themselves liable to be adjudged by the Committee from receiving any prize, which may have been awarded to them.
- The Society will not be responsible for any accident caused through any exhibit and will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss or miss-delivery of livestock or other exhibits of any kind or for any damage done thereto.
- 6 All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the judges appointed by the Committee, and on all protests the decision of the Committee shall be final.
- All protests must be delivered to the Secretary, in writing before 4 pm on the day of the Show, accompanied by a fee of \$2, which will be forfeited if the protest is

deemed frivolous. It shall be the duty of the person protesting to produce evidence in support of the allegation. Protest shall be heard by the Committee at such times and places as it deems proper.

- 8. Should the Committee have any reason to suspect that any exhibits are either diseased or dangerous, they reserve the right to refuse or to remove it from the ground at the expense of the exhibitor.
- 9. Exhibitors for farm produce, flowers, fruit and vegetables must be the growers. Exhibitors of jams, jellies, preserves, cakes and manufactured productions must be the makers and be of amateur status, other than classes deemed to be 'Open'. Art, craft, needlework and knitting exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
- 10. If in the opinion of the judge an exhibit is improperly classed, it may be removed by the stewards and placed in its proper class.
- 11. Unlawful games or games of chance or gambling are strictly prohibited. Any person infringing this rule will be ordered from the grounds.
- 12. All competitors, exhibitors and members of the public enter the Show Ground at their own risk, and the Society will not be held responsible for any loss, injury or damage.
- 13. The definition of 'The Braidwood District' is any Person, Animal, or Plant that resides in the Braidwood Postal Code of 2622.

- Exhibits in Sections I to W except U will be received by the stewards at the Pavilion Thursday from 2:00pm to 8:00pm and Friday 7:00am to 10:00am before the Show.
- **Please note:** Exhibits for Section U Schoolwork are only entered through the schools and will be collected from the schools one week prior to the Show.
- Exhibitors Please Note; It is a condition of entry that all exhibits remain on display until 4.30pm on the day of the Show and are released by the Section Stewards.

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

250g (8 oz) sultanas 250 g (8 oz) chopped raisins 250 g (8 oz) currants 125 g (4 oz) chopped mixed peel 90 g (3oz) chopped red glace cherries 90 g (3 oz) chopped blanched almonds 1/3 cup sherry or brandy 250 g (8 oz) plain flour 60 g (2 oz) self-raising flour 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves 250g (8 oz) butter 250g (8 oz) soft brown sugar 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind 1/2 teaspoon almond essence 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence 4 large eggs

#### **RECOMMENDED METHOD:**

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.


